

Supporting fit testing: steps and actions to be taken where staff may require the use of FFP3 masks

The algorithm below has been produced to help NHS organisations to identify the steps they should take where staff are to be deployed to clinical areas which require FFP3 respirator masks to be worn. It will assist organisations to determine actions required when an individual passes or fails a fit test.

As stated in the Government's recent <u>PPE strategy</u>, there is now greater security of supply of PPE with new UK manufactured products, including FFP3 respirator masks, to be used by the NHS.

Fit testing of respirator face masks is a legal requirement and supporting effective fit testing of existing and new models is essential for protecting our NHS staff.

Good practice in fit testing

- Regular audit of fit testing compliance with Board level oversight.
- Ongoing evaluation of staff experience of fit testing procedures and Plan, Do, Study, Act (PDSA) cycles.
- Ensuring equity of access to fit testing for all staff groups including contracted staff, porters and cleaners, supported by clear communication.



^{*} Organisations should ensure they have appropriate PPE available to make reasonable adjustments as needed.

^{**} This could include a centrally held staff database such as health roster or electronic staff record (ESR). The fit test report should be available to the employee and accessible to others such as the Health and Safety Executive if needed. Reports should be available to the Board, safety representatives and may be requested by NHS England and NHS Improvement regional teams.
