Background to the London Health Commission:



An **independent inquiry**, chaired by Ara Darzi and reporting directly to the Mayor of London.



Examining **how London's health and wellbeing, healthcare and the health economy can be improved** for the benefit of the population.



Underpinned by engagement with the public, local government, the NHS, business, the voluntary and community sector, and others.



Final report to be produced in Autumn 2014 which describes the **future vision for health and wellbeing** in London and makes **recommendations for the Mayor, NHS and other stakeholders**.

There have been many London reviews – so we need to reflect on how this Commission can make an impact:



Increasingly cities are the innovators of health improvement



When London acts, it has national and international resonance



Use the voice of an independent Commission to engage patients, the public and London



Leverage the Mayor's position and powers
