Achievements

- Cardiac Mandates have been signed off by Chief Execs of the 4 largest SL Trusts.
- The draft ODN Governance paper and supporting Terms of Reference is being refined and input is being received from CEs and MDs.
- The first 4 interventions which have been prioritised for plan development are as follows:
 - o Introduce collective purchasing among South London network for procurement
 - o Expand the current inter-hospital transfer system
 - o Develop consistent cardiac service pathways
 - o Strengthen multi-disciplinary team (MDT) working
- Weekly Working Group sessions have been held for each of the above interventions to date with a focus on scope, KPIs and project timelines.
- Close engagement across providers is ongoing to gain commitment to ODN set up and implementation.
- Initial SME input (e.g. Director of Procurement at GSTT; Teleologic) has been provided on the plans. These will continue as the plans are refined.

- As a priority, complete transfer of funding necessary to commence recruitment of PMO roles.
- Confirm benefits profiling in working session and share with Working Group to finalise timescales w/c 06/11.
- Refine draft governance; Refine plans with Working Group (including timescales and resourcing requirements to deliver).
- Circulate draft cardiac plans for review and input w/c 13/11.
- Continue to highlight interdependencies and align with CVIN work.

- Renal Mandates have been signed off by Chief Execs of the 4 largest SL Trusts.
- The draft ODN Governance paper and supporting Terms of Reference is being refined and input is being received from CEs and MDs.
- The first 4 agreed interventions for plan development have been agreed as follows:
 - o Enhance shared decision making for advanced care planning
 - o Introduce virtual clinics with primary care
 - o Enhance shared decision making for renal treatment
 - o Introduce collective purchasing among South London network for procurement
- Lorna Donegan, with prior ODN Lead experience, has been recruited to support Steve.
- · So far, one Working Group has been held, focused on Advanced care planning.
- Links have been established with existing good practice and pilots to identify scope, interdependencies and approaches (e.g. Virtual Clinics at GSTT and Bart's; ACP at Epsom)
- MDs have been asked to support with nominating Champions and patient representation for each intervention. A Renal Conference has been also planned for 24 November to present back plans and engage on next steps.
