

# London Payment Process for 'Off Label' vaccines and Vaccinations used outside Section 7a immunisation Programmes

For incomplete Hepatitis B vaccination see attached

Anything outside Section 7a immunisation programmes is a Prescription Specific Directive. Vaccinations will need to be ordered directly from the manufacturer or can be obtained via the prescription portal (FP10)

Vaccine Stock on Immform are reserved for the national Section 7a programmes

For vaccine product reimbursement for influenza, pneumococcal, meningococcal, hep A, hep B, typhoid, claim via CCG using FP34D/PD (<http://www.nhshsa.nhs.uk/prescriptionservices/933.aspx>)

For all other vaccines, claim via FP10 unless it is post-exposure intervention, then order directly from the manufacturer.

For vaccine administration payments:

Numbers are likely to be small and infrequent, therefore payment falls under the GMS additional services (1.5% of global sum)

Submit via CQRS to NHSE (London) or via Open Exeter (parameters amended by NHSE to reflect that incomplete vaccines fall within NHSE remit.)

# Situations you may encounter

1. As part of individual treatment
  - A 21 year old male in a motorcycle accident with an incomplete vaccination status
  - Individual treatment indicates the patient needs a tetanus vaccination. The vaccination cannot be given from national stock and needs to be ordered and reimbursed via an FP10. The immunisation should be recorded on the patient record and submitted via CQRS as an incomplete vaccination.
  
2. 'Off label' vaccines – incomplete vaccination schedules requiring completion
  - A 21 year old male who has had no MMR vaccinations
  - The Green Book states that MMR can be given at any age and should be if the patient is susceptible. For those born after 1970, vaccinations can now be given from national stock and claimed via CQRS as an incomplete vaccination.
  
3. Vaccination of at risk groups recommended by the Green Book but not covered by Section 7a
  - The British HIV Association recommend that all HIV patients receive PCV13
  - Individual treatment indicates the patient should have PCV13. The vaccination cannot be given from the national stock and should be ordered and reimbursed via a FP34D.
  
4. Outbreaks of vaccine preventable diseases where PHE recommends mass vaccinations following an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease
  - MMR for prison staff and prisoners following a measles outbreak in a prison
  - On recommendation by the local health protection unit, vaccinations may be required for a group of at risk individuals following an outbreak. MMR vaccinations should be ordered and reimbursed via an FP10 and offered for free of charge to the patient under the NHS.

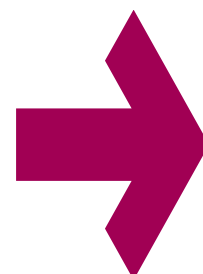


# Guidance on payments for vaccines: National Immunisation Schemes 1

Vaccine Name	Situations where vaccine is offered free of charge under the NHS Global sum	Method for claiming payment under global sum
<b>Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio and Haemophilus influenzae type b (DTaP/IPV/Hib)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis and Polio (DTaP/IPV)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Diphtheria (low dose), Tetanus, Pertussis and Polio (dTaP/IPV)</b>	Pregnant women and new mothers national immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Hib / Meningococcal group C (Hib/MenC)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Human Papillomavirus (HPV) (Gardasil)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Influenza inactivated vaccine (adults over 18 years of age)</b>	Immunisation offered under the NHS on an annual basis for those aged 65 years and over or those aged six months to 64 years and in a risk category	FP34D
<b>Influenza inactivated vaccine (from 6 months to 18 years of age)</b>	Immunisation offered under the NHS on an annual basis for those aged 6 months to 2 years in an at risk category, and those who are eligible for influenza vaccination but in whom the nasal influenza vaccine is contraindicated	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Influenza (Nasal spray live attenuated vaccine)</b>	Immunisation (as nasal spray) for children aged 2 to 18 years for the cohort defined by the latest annual Flu letter and those defined as at risk.	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme and those born after 1970	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34

Vaccine Name	Situations where vaccine is offered free of charge under the NHS Global sum	Method for claiming payment under global sum
<b>Meningococcal ACWY conjugate vaccination (MenACWY)</b>	National Immunisation scheme from August 2015	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Meningococcal B (MenB)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme from 1st September 2015	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Meningococcal C (MenC)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine (PPV)</b>	Offered under the NHS for those aged 65 years and over or those aged under 65 years in a clinical risk category outlined in latest advice from CMO.	FP34D
<b>Rotavirus</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Shingles</b>	National Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34
<b>Tetanus, diphtheria (low dose) and polio (Td/IPV)</b>	National Childhood Immunisation scheme	Free supply through ImmForm. Do NOT claim on FP10 or FP34

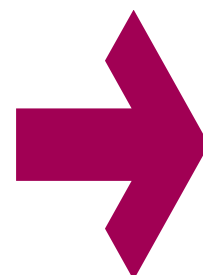


# Guidance on payments for vaccines : Travel Vaccines 1

Vaccine Name	Situations where vaccine is offered free of charge under the NHS Global sum	Method for claiming payment under global sum
<b>Cholera</b>	Travellers to an areas where risk of exposure is high – defined by NaTHNac Travellers to a country where immunisation is a condition of entry	FP10
<b>Diphtheria</b> (only available as combined vaccines)	<b>For travellers visiting epidemic or endemic areas</b> it is recommended that the combined Td/IPV is given where a booster of any element is required	FP10
<b>Hepatitis A</b>	Travellers to an area where risk of exposure is high -defined by NaTHNac	FP34D
<b>Hepatitis B (single agent)</b>	Not remunerated by the NHS as part of additional services. However, a practice may choose whether to give single Hep B for travel on the NHS or privately – see link to “BMA Hep B Focus” for more info <a href="http://bma.org.uk/practical-support-at-work/gppractices/focus-hepatitis-b-immunisations">http://bma.org.uk/practical-support-at-work/gppractices/focus-hepatitis-b-immunisations</a> Refer also to individual CCG policy if applicable	FP34D (unless provided as private service)
<b>Hepatitis A and B combined</b>	In the few limited cases where hepatitis A & B is required the combined vaccine may be used (see Green Book)	FP34D
<b>Hepatitis A and Typhoid Combined</b>	Advised where sanitation is primitive and where the degree of exposure to infection is likely to be high. See Green Book and latest advice from CMO.	FP34D
<b>Japanese B encephalitis</b>	Not provided on the NHS	
<b>Meningococcal A,C, W135 &amp; Y</b>	Not remunerated by the NHS as part of additional services. Practice to use discretion and may levy a fee for a private supply. Refer also to individual CCG policy if applicable	FP34D (unless provided as private service)
<b>Poliomyelitis inactivated (only available as combined vaccines)</b>	For travellers visiting epidemic or endemic areas it is recommended that the combined Td/IPV is given where a booster of any element is required.	FP10
<b>Rabies</b>	Not provided on the NHS	

# Guidance on payments for vaccines : Travel Vaccines 2

Vaccine Name	Situations where vaccine is offered free of charge under the NHS Global sum	Method for claiming payment under global sum
<b>Tetanus (only available as combined vaccines) Tetanus, diphtheria (low dose) and polio (Td/IPV)</b>	Travellers requiring vaccination or booster.	FP10
<b>Tick-borne encephalitis</b>	Not provided on the NHS	
<b>Typhoid polysaccharide</b>	Travellers to countries where typhoid is endemic. Travellers to a country where immunisation is a condition of entry	FP34D
<b>Yellow fever</b>	Not provided on the NHS. Travellers seeking vaccination may only be offered as a private service via designated Yellow Fever Vaccination Centres.	
<b>Other, less common vaccines for travel e.g. BCG, Pertussis</b>	For travellers meeting the requirements set out in the Green Book	FP10

Vaccine Name	Situations where vaccine is offered free of charge under the NHS Global sum	Method for claiming payment under global sum
<b>Hepatitis A</b>	See Green Book for list of at risk patient groups	FP34D
<b>Hepatitis B</b>	See Green Book for list of at risk groups eligible for Hep B (excluding travel)	FP34D
<b>Haemophilus Influenza type b (Hib/MenC)</b>	Asplenic children and adults.	FP10
<b>Meningococcal A,C, W135 &amp; Y</b>	Asplenic children and adults.	FP34D
<b>Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)</b>	See Green Book for list of at risk patient groups	FP34D
<b>Varicella (Chickenpox)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Close household contacts of immunocompromised patients</li> <li>• Management of at-risk individuals following significant exposure to chicken pox or varicella zoster (See Green Book).</li> </ul>	FP10
<b>Post-exposure immunisations</b>	Certain vaccinations may be recommended by the local Health Protection Unit for possible contacts of vaccine-preventable infectious diseases, and these should be offered free of charge under the NHS.	Order directly from manufacturer
