Mapping Health and Justice pathways for children and young people across Local Transformation Plan areas in the West Midlands Clinical Network

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The Children & Young People's Mental Health Transformation Programme is a nationwide programme looking to improve the health outcomes for children and young people. It aims to support the delivery of the recommendations detailed in the Children & Young People's Mental Health & Wellbeing Taskforce, Future in Mind report.

There are three Health & Justice workstreams within this programme, these include:

- Workstream 1: Specialist Child & Adolescent Mental Health Services for High Risk Young People with Complex Needs;
- Workstream 2: Development of a framework for integrated care for the children and young people's secure estate;
- Workstream 3: Collaborative Commissioning Networks.

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- NHS England is asking CCGs to continue and accelerate intensive work with local partners across the NHS, public health, children's social care, youth justice and education sectors to jointly develop and take forward local plans to transform the local offer to improve children and young people's health and wellbeing.
- These Local Transformation Plans should cover the full spectrum of interventions from prevention to support and care for existing, or emerging mental health problems, as well as transitions between services and address the needs of the most vulnerable.



Within the West Midlands Clinical Networks footprint, there are 11 LTP areas:

In April 2016 NHS England Health & Justice – North Midlands commissioned a report from KPMG [Health & Justice CAMHS Transformation Workstream Report] as part of the delivery of Workstream 3 (Collaborative Commissioning Networks), which identified that "no single organisation has overview of pathway, with gaps in provision at transition points, variations in provision across the region."

This report set out a series of recommendations under the theme 'Pathways & Provision' these included:

- Map pathways from end to end to ensure awareness of full pathway across agencies
- All secure settings and SARCs to have clearly defined CAMHS pathways with clear and consistent referral processes



The Project

The West Midlands Clinical Networks have commissioned the North East Commissioning Support Unit (NECS) to carry out the pathways mapping work with key local stakeholders to map 'Health and Justice' pathways for children and young across the individual Local Transformation Plan (LTP) footprints. This will include those pathways transitioning in and out of **Secure Estates**, **Sexual Assault Referral Centres** and **Liaison & Diversion Services**.



As part of the project, we will be working with the West Midlands Clinical Networks, identified Local Transformation Plan Leads and other key partners to:

- Map existing end to end Health & Justice pathways that are in place locally for those individuals aged 0-21 years. To include:
 - The names of the organisations who deliver each part of the pathway and their commissioners;
 - Data outlining the activity associated to each part of the pathway;
 - Costs associated to delivering each part of the pathway;
 - Governance arrangements in place to oversee each part of the pathway.
- Identification of transitional arrangements including the management of information from one organisation to another;
- Identification of key challenges and risks associated to gaps in the pathway;
- Examples of good practice;
- Transition points and/or overlap with pathways in other areas
