

Hidden Figures: LGBT Health Inequalities in the UK
The Government's National LGBT Survey, released in 2018, overwhelmingly demonstrates that there are still significant barriers faced by LGBT people in the UK today. The survey confirmed that growing up LGBT in an intolerant society, experiencing prejudice and rejection, can exacerbate health inequalities and have a negative impact on health outcomes compared to the general population.



Consider Pronouns

If a person chooses to tell you their pronouns (in their signature line or otherwise), they are simply letting you know how you can refer to them, without you having to make any assumptions. When we write policies, guidelines and protocols we should also use 'they' when referring to others and not binary alternatives such as 'she/her/hers' or 'he/him/his' as we want to get it right for everyone.

Thursday 24th February

Rugby legend Gareth Thomas

In 2009 Gareth became the first active professional rugby player to come out as gay, and many hailed this as one of the bravest decisions ever in sport. The following year he was voted the most influential gay person in the UK in The Independent On Sunday, and was also given the Stonewall Hero of the Year award.

More recently he has spoken about his HIV diagnosis:

"Many people live in fear and shame of having HIV, but I refuse to be one of them now. We need to break the stigma once and for all. "I'm speaking out because I want to help others and make a difference."

The day following this announcement he completed a 140 mile triathlon, which helped to show that people living with HIV are not "frail and weak". The Terence Higgins Trust also saw an immediate rise in people accessing self-test kits, and information from their website and telephone service.


