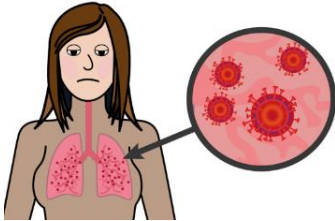




## Pneumococcal Vaccination

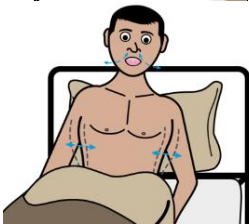
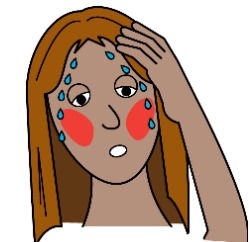
### Pneumonia



The Pneumococcal Vaccine helps **protect** against pneumonia.

Pneumonia is an **infection** in the lung.

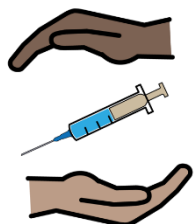
Pneumonia can make people really **poorly**.



Symptoms of pneumonia include:

- Feeling very hot
- Sweating and shivering
- Finding it hard to breathe
- A cough
- Not feeling hungry

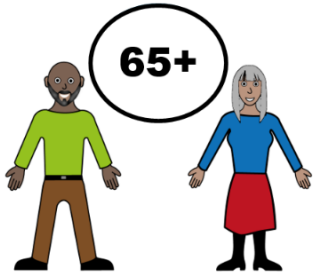
### protection



The pneumococcal vaccine also **protects** against

**Meningitis** (an infection in the brain and spinal cord)  
and

**Sepsis** (a life-threatening reaction to an infection)



**Everyone** aged **65** and over should have one dose.

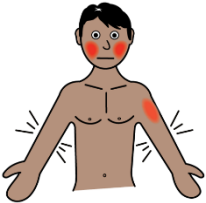
Some people who are **at risk** may need **more** than one dose.

### injection



You can get your Pneumococcal Vaccination **at the same time as other vaccinations**, like your Flu vaccination.

### possible side effects

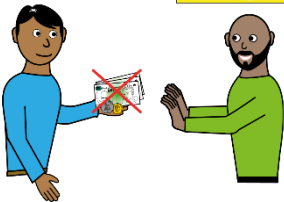


**Side effects** from the injection are usually **not serious**.

Sometimes you can get a **lump** or **pain** where the injection was given, a **fever**, feeling **tired** or **not feeling hungry**.

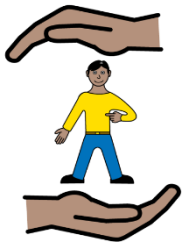
Not everyone gets side effects.

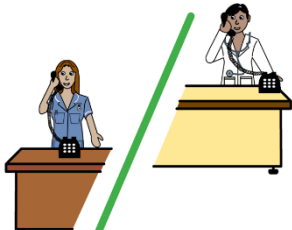
The vaccination is **free**.
