Summary

As a Network Clinical Lead, the post holder will work as part of a dynamic Clinical Network support service across the geographical region of the North West Coast (Lancashire and South Cumbria). The post-holder will support the strategic and operational development and delivery of coherent and effective network arrangements, ensuring activities are aligned to and support commissioners in achieving outcome ambitions for patients and benefits to population health.

Roles & Responsibilities

- To provide professional and clinical leadership to an agreed network/networks in the defined area
- Support the leadership of the work programme alongside the SROs
- Identify and key interventions to improve the quality, safety and efficiency of patient care
- Engage clinical colleagues from own specialty and beyond to build clinical support to the changes
- Articulate and promote the vision for change with clinical colleagues and champion the sharing of innovation and standardisation of care across L&SC
- Lead the development of agreed clinical deliverables such as L&SC clinical standards, and model of care to inform new commissioner service specifications
- Deliver targeted engagement with patients, members of the public and other wider stakeholders as required
- Report to L&SC governance meetings as required e.g., PCB, ICS Executive

Key Job Specific Responsibilities

Duties include but are not limited to:

- To be a clinical leader and champion for the Neurorehabilitation Workstream within the L&SC ISNDN
- To foster a culture of multi-professional engagement in the improvement of care

across integrated pathways for a specific condition or patient group. This will include collaborating and engaging with clinical colleagues to deliver ambitious programmes of quality improvement.

- To provide clinical leadership for the development and delivery of network activities in each geographical patch.
- To create and maintain network structures that support widespread multidisciplinary involvement including doctors, nurses, allied health professionals and clinical scientists.
- To act as a champion for patients and their interests and involve the public and patients in the strategy development and decision-making of the Networks.
- To engage and develop collaborations for quality improvement across whole health communities, for the realisation of equitable access to quality care and the achievement of outcome ambitions for patients.
