

Background



OF indicator 5.5 - Admission of full term babies to neonatal care:

- Reduction of avoidable term admissions to NNU
- Recognition that maternal morbidity plays a part
- Need as a proportion of all births ONS
- ONS data (Oct 16, 2014) = 0.9% rise in 2012.



NDAU – NNRD: Primary reasons for admission


Top 5:
