1. Supporting Information

- Work in progress

2. Selection, training and supervision of appraisers

- Support the leads
- · Correct selection is key right at the start
- Special skill set
- Concern about workforce
- Audit of outputs

3. Logistics

- Some don't need licence
- Varying systems each with pro's and con's
- Making allowances is OK at this point
- Having a good vehicle is important

4. Information Governance

- 'Cinderella' topic, but very important and can be a bear trap
- Simple guidance reminder to appraisers might help
- Information revealed in app. Conversation (re. health)
- 5. <u>Training the doctors</u> What training do our doctors need to help them get the most out of their appraisal?
 - a. A variety of current approaches around the table, from very little to commissioned external training for doctors x 2
 - b. Pre-appraisal meeting
 - c. Provision of guidance
 - d. BMA course
 - e. Whole system meeting
 - f. Use appraisers to focus meeting and guide/teach the doctor
