



## Suggested tweets to help you share your news

The safety of patients is everyone's responsibility; whether a board member, nurse, clinician or support worker. We ask you to communicate the commitments your organisation has made, and encourage all staff to play their part in creating a joyful, supportive, open and collaborative workplace that is dedicated to continuous learning.

Twitter is a great way to do this as it's free (apart from time spent) and many organisations now already have a twitter feed with followers amongst staff, patients and the public. We've prepared some tweets to save you time, but feel free to amend these as you think best for your audiences.

In a nutshell:

- The campaign Twitter handle is @SignuptoSafety.
  - You can make sure we're aware of any of your tweets by including this
- The hashtag to use when letting twitter know that you are sharing your pledges, Safety Improvement Plans and associated news or pictures is #signuptosafety
  - This will allow us to see how far this news has travelled
