Seasonal Flu Programme 21/22 - Flu Letter

Every year a tripartite annual flu letter is published which is the main communication about which groups will be eligible for flu vaccination in the coming flu season. This year there will continue to be an expanded flu vaccination programme as part of the wider winter planning where it is thought that we are likely to see both influenza and COVID-19 in circulation. This means that alongside the usual eligible groups, all 50 -64 year olds will again be offered flu vaccination and the programme is being expanded into secondary schools up to Year 11 for the first time, these will be delivered by the School Aged Imms Providers in the South West.
