### Use of AZ for housebound patients

For housebound, as for other patients, Pfizer or half dose Moderna remain the preferred vaccines for the booster dose as there is some evidence that this potentially provides a better boost. However, AZ can be considered in exceptional circumstances for this group of patients where the logistics are very difficult e.g. where the persons needing these services are dispersed and / or in very rural areas making it difficult to facilitate use of the vaccine for them in an acceptable time-frame. AZ should only be used as a booster where the individual has already received at least one dose of AZ previously, or for those who have not previously received AZ where this is being recommended following referral to an immunologist / allergist. The advice around storage, transport and use of Pfizer has changed significantly from previous phases of the programme and is not as difficult to transport and administer particularly in urban settings where there may be a number of individuals in relatively close proximity. Additional funds have been provided to mitigate the 15 min wait required post administration of an m RNA vaccine up until the beginning of December.

# CQRS Notification- 2021/22 NHSEI Public Health Commissioned Services

This is a notification regarding Public Health Section 7a services that NHS England and NHS Improvement (NHSEI) commission from you via Calculating Quality Reporting Service (CQRS)

### **EMIS - Seasonal Flu Data Issues**

NHS Digital has been notified of an issue with the pharmacy reference sets, impacting extracts for the Seasonal Flu service. This has resulted in some incorrect submissions for October 2021 claims for EMIS practices only. The impact is specifically related to eligible asthmatic patients who have received a flu vaccination for no other reason.

In response, NHS Digital is working with EMIS to investigate this issue and re-extract data to correct claims that have not yet been approved. Timings are being confirmed for this re-extract and further updates will be provided on the actions being taken to resolve this issue.

### **Impact**

- Practices impacted by this issue may receive an underpayment relating to activity in October 2021
- Declarations in CQRS that have already been approved and submitted to PCSE will have been processed for payment for October 2021 activity. Work has started to confirm the process to address any approved underpayments
- There may be a delay to the submission of November 2021 achievement data for this service whilst the issue is addressed

#### **EMIS Practices**

- No further declarations for the Seasonal Flu Service should be completed for October 2021 claims only **until further notice**
- Declarations may continue for September 2021 Flu claims
- Declarations may continue for all other services
