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ICARS COVID-19 Newsletter

We are pleased to bring you the latest updates from our ICARS service. This newsletter is attached to your email along with associated documents.

Cervical Screening Campaign

From 14 February 2022, the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID), supported by the NHS England and NHS Improvement will launch a new Cervical Screening campaign designed to increase the number of those eligible to attend their screening.

The campaign will raise awareness of the risks of cervical cancer and highlight the preventative benefits of screening. The overall aim of the campaign is to increase the number of those eligible to attend their screening. It will encourage those eligible for screening - women and people with a

cervix aged 25-64 - to respond to their cervical screening invitation letter, and to book an appointment with their GP practice if they missed their last screening.

The campaign will also actively target sub-groups who may experience additional barriers to attending screening – ethnic minority (Black and South Asian communities) and LGBTQ+ people with a cervix.

Two women die every day from cervical cancer in England, yet it is one of the most preventable cancers. Around 2,700 women in England are diagnosed with cervical cancer each year and it is the second most common cancer amongst women under 35.

PPV – Opportunity to extend to all eligible cohorts if stocks available.

All those who are over 65, and those aged 2-64 who are at a higher risk of developing a pneumococcal infection than the general population are eligible for the one off PPV vaccine. Stocks of PPV have often limited the opportunity for who can be vaccinated with those at risk encouraged to be prioritised. Currently there is a cap on the number of vaccines that can be ordered, however it is currently quite high at 30 per week. Therefore, if you have completed vaccination within the high priority groups and have vaccine available, you can continue to extend this to all those eligible. Consideration should be given when ordering stock to ensure risk to stock wastage is mini mised.
