Foreword from Linda Taylor, Leader of Cornwall Council

For the first time in Cornwall's history, we have a Conservative Council working with six Conservative MPs and a Conservative Government. I am determined that together we create a better Cornwall for all of our residents.

Since forming this new administration, we have thought long and hard about what we would see as our measures of success for the next four years. Put simply, our priorities are the same as those of our residents – making Cornwall:

- A brilliant place to be a child and grow up
- In a thriving, sustainable Cornwall that offers a secure home, a decent income and a great environment for all
- With vibrant, safe, supportive communities where people help each other live well
- All supported by an empowering and enterprising Council that provides good value for money and gets it right first time for customers



These priorities will underpin everything we do over the next four years. And we have already begun. We have been named as the nation's leading local authority in tackling the climate crisis, with judges commenting that Cornwall Council is "forging ahead in the race to net-zero, nature-based solutions and climate adaptation." Through hosting the G7 Summit, we have secured the Prime Minister's backing to make Cornwall the first net zero region and stimulated international investment interest in growing our green economy. As a Council, and following formal adoption of a children's rights approach in November, we are at the forefront of embedding the rights of the child in everything we do.

Above all, we have been united in our efforts to protect our most vulnerable and support our communities. From rapid action to tackle the housing crisis, to a tireless focus on keeping people safe as we learn to live with COVID-19, we have seen just what can be achieved when we work together with communities. This ethos is at the heart of our plans to create a carbon neutral Cornwall where everyone can start well, live well and age well.

We will always remember that the money we spend is your money:


30% comes from the Council Tax paid by our residents



18% comes from the business rates paid by our local business owners



42% comes via Government from the other taxes which you pay. Most of this can only be used for specific services like schools or housing benefit



8% comes from the charges you pay to cover the cost of specific services like planning, licensing and parking



2% comes from other sources including investment income



We will use every penny wisely to deliver the priorities that residents have told us matter most. Our value for money commitment is to deliver really good services within budget.

We want every child to have the best start in life and an equal chance of a bright future here in Cornwall. The voices and views of children and young people are at the heart of our plans. We will support our young people to get the most out of growing up in Cornwall and gain the skills to access new jobs in our changing economy.

We are determined to make Cornwall a place where every child can grow up...

Mentally and physically healthy

Over 2,000 children in Cornwall took part in the 'Make Your Mark' youth survey and their top ask is that we support their mental health. Clinically significant mental health conditions amongst children have risen 50% compared to 2017, and one in six children now have a probable mental health condition. We will give every child a healthy start, and the skills to make healthy choices. We will provide support at the earliest opportunity and aim to prevent escalation to other services. We will do this by listening to children and young people on the support they need.

Enjoying, learning and achieving

Disadvantaged children in Cornwall in 2019 were 5.4 months of learning behind their peers at the end of reception class. By Key Stage 2 this learning gap had widened to 11.3 months. The pandemic disrupted learning for all children. Disadvantaged children lost more months of learning than the average.

Research shows that by the age of 30, people with the highest levels of education are expected to live four years longer than people with the lowest levels of education. Children's earliest experiences define their outcomes in childhood and into adult life. Those who fall behind before school often struggle to catch up. To change the odds for our most disadvantaged children, we will focus on their first 1,001 days and provide our youngest children with the best start in life.

Living in safety and with stability

Every child should have the security of a warm, safe, loving home. Rising numbers are growing up in families that cannot afford adequate food or housing. Some parents are juggling the stresses of insecure jobs and debt. In an increasing number of cases, parents are struggling with mental ill health, addiction, or domestic abuse. As part of our plans to ensure everyone has the chance of a secure home and a decent income, we will reduce the number of children living in insecure accommodation and poverty.

Accessing good jobs and a great environment

Children tell us they love Cornwall's beautiful natural environment. They want more job opportunities so that they can see a good future for themselves here. We are determined to help our young people gain the skills and careers advice to access new jobs in high growth sectors like space and satellite, creative and digital industries, and renewable technologies. Careers guidance will be more relevant, engage parents as key influencers and better reflect our changing local economy. We also want to make sure every child can access the best that Cornwall has to offer including our beautiful beaches and green spaces. We will support children and young people to be more physically active and make the most of growing up in Cornwall. We will reduce the numbers that are not in education, employment or training.

Belonging and contributing as part of a society which respects their rights

A sense of belonging - of being accepted and included in a wider community - has important health benefits throughout life. Childhood is a vital time to cultivate positive social skills. We will champion the rights of children in Cornwall and give them a strong say over decisions affecting them. We will support them to make a positive contribution to their school and wider community.



Our plans to make Cornwall carbon neutral will grow nature and boost our green economy. We will support our residents to access new job opportunities and level up life chances for people across Cornwall.

A secure home, a decent income, and a great environment for all



We want to ensure that everyone in Cornwall has the opportunity for:

A secure home for all

Both house prices and rental costs in Cornwall have risen by over 15% in the last year. With over 500 households in temporary accommodation, we are determined to help those who cannot find and afford a secure home.

We will:

 provide more homes that local people can afford to rent or buy. We will bring about a step change in the supply of high quality homes that local people can afford to rent or buy, working with Government, housing associations and developers.

We will bring long-term empty properties back into use and support people to downsize from under-occupied homes. We will also clamp down on excouncil homes where they are wrongly being used for holiday lets.

Our new rough sleeper assessment centre will help us to reduce the number of people sleeping rough in Cornwall.

- prevent homelessness and reduce the number of people living in insecure temporary accommodation. We will reduce the number of people sleeping rough in Cornwall. We are opening a new rough sleeper assessment centre and we will accelerate delivery of our programme to provide decent self-contained temporary accommodation.
- We will also provide financial support and assistance to help people in privately rented homes mediate with their landlords, and so prevent homelessness.
- be a good landlord and raise standards for people who rent in Cornwall. We provide council homes for over 10,000 households across Cornwall.
 Our commitment is to provide good quality housing and support for all of our tenants.

We will intervene to raise standards across the wider rented sector and wherever possible we will improve security for people in rented accommodation. A thriving, sustainable Cornwall

A decent income for all

The G7 Summit has generated new global investment interest in our creative carbon zero economy. This is vital for our local economy as we want to create more higher paid jobs so that we can reduce the number of households reliant on Universal Credit. We know that many employers in Cornwall are experiencing labour shortages, so we will provide training and support for our residents to take up those jobs.

We will:

- turbo-charge Cornwall's economy by facilitating growth and increased investment in our green economy including high potential sectors like space and satellite, mining and tech metals, renewable energy and digital. Our plans to tackle the housing crisis will help boost the construction industry and create more jobs for people in Cornwall. We will also support Cornwall's wider network of businesses of every size to innovate, increase their productivity, decarbonise and grow.
- support people of all ages to retrain, learn new skills and realise their ambitions. We are determined that local residents benefit from new job opportunities in our high growth sectors. This will mean increased take up of apprenticeships and fewer people out of work. We will better align training with the skills needs of local employers in our changing economy and accelerate digital skills development. We will deliver proactive outreach to those furthest from the labour market. We will support them with skills and the challenges associated with poverty, insecure housing, ill health and wellbeing. - champion good business, with more jobs paid the Foundation Living Wage. We support the Good Business Charter. This commits businesses to pay the foundation living wage, helping to end inwork poverty. We will lead by example through our responsible procurement policy. This will make sure our suppliers are making a positive and measurable difference in Cornwall as part of our commitment to support local jobs.
- regenerate our high streets with vibrant, attractive town centres across Cornwall. Our approach to place shaping is firmly focused on supporting local communities to achieve their local priorities and create jobs. We will support towns across Cornwall to revitalise their local economies and become more sustainable and better connected places, where people need to travel less.

We are determined that local residents benefit from new job opportunities in our high growth sectors.

A great environment for all

We want you to love where you live so we will put communities in the driving seat to improve their local neighbourhood and natural environment.

We will:

- create a cleaner, safer, greener Cornwall. Our Keep Cornwall Clean campaign is tackling dog fouling and environmental crimes as well as supporting over 150 community litter picks every year. We will roll out a new waste service to help you reduce your waste and re-use, recycle and compost more. We also want to create living streets that everyone can enjoy and use safely, with more walking and cycling. We will reduce traffic speeds with more 20mph zones in communities across Cornwall.
- grow nature and create habitats for wildlife to recover and thrive. Nature is in crisis in Cornwall. Over 20 bird and 8 bee species went extinct locally in the last 50 years. Around 50 of our most important species are now under threat. We will grow a Nature Recovery Network in Cornwall which will create wildflower habitats for pollinators. Woodlands and wetlands will be restored as part of our nature-based solutions to fight climate change. We will create new green spaces for current and future generations to enjoy.
- decarbonise the Council as part of our commitment to a carbon neutral Cornwall. We will halve our carbon emissions over the four years 2022/26, and we will increase our carbon capture by directly funding over 140,000 new trees as part of our growing Forest for Cornwall. This will keep us on course to become a net carbon neutral Council by 2030.

Vibrant, safe, supportive communities

We want everyone to feel safe and a part of their local community. We will work with our communities to help them achieve their local priorities and to help each other live well and thrive. Our community based approach will help residents and visitors alike to enjoy the best of Cornwall - and ensure that when people need extra support, they get the right care, in the right place, at the right time.

We will help people to live well and thrive at home



Across Cornwall there are amazing people coming together to do things they care about and create positive change in their communities. This includes organising sporting clubs and cultural events, volunteering to support others facing crises in their lives, rejuvenating their neighbourhoods, making space for nature and tackling climate change. This culture of "Can-Do Cornwall" is one of our greatest assets.

Build communities' capacity to help each other live well and safely

Communities come in all shapes and sizes. These could be people living in the same neighbourhood, village or town through to groups who share a common passion or challenge, including minority groups. We will listen and work with communities across Cornwall because the best understanding of what the community needs comes from within the community.

We will:

 give communities more control over local assets and remove barriers to community action. Cutting red tape will make it easier for communities to work with the Council. We want to create opportunities for communities to drive the changes that are important to them using their own talents, assets and resources.

- connect people with community support. When
 we help others in our community we also build our
 own personal resilience. This is the self-awareness,
 positive outlook and confidence to ask for help that
 enables us all to cope better with life's challenges.
 Helping others is good for us so we will work with
 Cornwall's vibrant voluntary sector to promote
 opportunities for people to volunteer and get involved
 in their community.
- work with our communities to keep people safe and free from harm. People across Cornwall rely on our services to keep them and their loved ones safe. This includes our fire and rescue service, through to our support for victims of domestic abuse, hate crime and youth violence. We will work with our partners to tackle anti-social behaviour and keep Cornwall one of the safest places to live in the country. We will also protect our residents from fraudulent businesses, scams and doorstep crime. We will support businesses across Cornwall to meet high standards of public health and achieve business success.

We want to increase communities' power and capacity to drive the changes that are important to them.

Preventing ill health and building personal resilience because health starts at home

There are widening health inequalities in Cornwall, with more people than ever before dependent on social care and support services. We will invest in preventing ill health and take a strengths-based approach to building personal and community resilience rather than simply focusing on problems. This increases people's coping skills, capability and confidence to overcome life's challenges and thrive.

We will:

- encourage everyone to take responsibility for their own wellbeing so people can live well for longer. We will help people do this by creating healthier environments where people live, work and play. We are here to help you make healthy **choices** - providing support to stop smoking, eat well and get active. Where people have poorer health we will support them to improve their health the fastest. Our focus on giving children a healthy start will also include building good emotional and mental wellbeing. We look after over 5,000 km of trails, bridleways and public rights of way, along with almost 150 beaches, parks and open spaces. These are all great places to get outdoors and get active. We also support our local museums, theatre and arts groups because we want our residents to be able to enjoy a life-enriching cultural and creative offer.
- work with our local NHS to shift investment into ill health prevention. We will focus on working upstream to prevent illness and enable people to live well with long term conditions or disabilities. Where people have complex needs we will collaborate closely with our voluntary and public sector partners to prevent people from tipping into crisis. After successive lockdowns, more people are struggling to cope with growing levels of mental ill health, financial stress, fuel poverty, domestic abuse and alcohol and drug problems. We are determined to provide early help and support for people to avoid reaching crisis point. This will include asking people what really matters to them to stay well. Through our

local partnerships we will use data and insights to proactively reach out to those needing help to offer financial inclusion, skills and employment support.

Providing the right care, in the right place, at the right time

When people do need extra support we will make it easy for them to access high quality services that enhance and develop their strengths. We call this 'right care, right place, right time'.

We will:

- invest in helping people live independently **because home is best.** We will fund adaptations to help people with a disability stay living in their own homes; deliver intensive reablement support to help more people go home after a stay in hospital rather than going into care homes; and we will build more homes where people with greater needs can live independently, with onsite support. We will also invest in technology which supports people to maintain their independence at home with the benefits of round-the-clock reassurance that help is at hand when it's most needed.
- strengthen our collaboration with voluntary sector partners. We will work together so that our collective skills and resources achieve the maximum benefit for residents. We will make more use of personalised budgets and place-based support. We will also enhance our support for Cornwall's unsung heroes - the unpaid carers who dedicate their time to help family or friends have a good quality of life at home.
- support more people to live independently for longer. This will enable us to focus our most highly trained capacity on supporting people with the most complex needs - providing them with the quality and dignity of care that we would all want for ourselves and our loved ones.
