# **NEW: PGD Published - Hib/MenC PGD V5.00 (Menitorix®)**

# This UPDATE relates to NHS vaccinations. Please share this with appropriate staff in your practice

Your team can now download a new PGD that has been authorised for the vaccination of patients registered with NHS medical practices in the South West of England.

Note that PGDs can only be used as legal authorisation for administration or supply of prescription-only medicines by a <u>limited number</u> of registered health professions. Other staff that cannot prescribe will require a patient specific direction (guidance <u>here</u>).

One new PGD has been authorised for a range of registered healthcare professionals to use.

#### Hib/MenC PGD V5.00 (Menitorix®) - valid from 31 July 2022

For the administration of Haemophilus influenzae type b and meningococcal C conjugate vaccine (Hib/MenC) to individuals from their first birthday to under 10 years of age in accordance with the national immunisation programme; and to individuals of any age for the prevention of secondary cases of meningococcal group C (MenC) disease.

#### Changes from V4.00:

- include minor rewording of standard text, layout and formatting changes for clarity and consistency with organisation change and other UKHSA PGDs.
- align criteria for exclusion to Green Book with reference to minor illness or systemic upset
- add full list of active excipients in the drug section
- add premature cohort in special considerations to align with Guidance for Public Health Management of Meningococcal Disease in the UK
- update references

# **NEW: Imvanex (MVA-BN) Vaccine Stock Expiry**

All Imvanex stock has a 2 year expiry at -20°C (so the current batch available has an expiry data of 09/2022).

Whereas the expiry date on the box may say a much later date as the assumption is that within the box it is being stored at -50 or -80 degrees.

This is an ask that all sites holding Imvanex stock to check the vial label for the expiry date when stored at -20°C.

In summary, <u>Imvanex ® vaccine has an 8-week shelf life at 2 - 8°C and sites should record the thawed expiry to the vaccination administration records.</u>
