May Bank Holidays

Support isolated people to self-refer for volunteer calls

People who would benefit from extra social contact can now self-refer for free 'Check In and Chat' phone calls from the NHS Volunteer Responders by calling 0808 196 3646. Alternatively, <u>clinicians and other primary care colleagues can directly refer people</u> with their consent. <u>GP practices and pharmacies can also order pre-printed posters and flyers to promote self-referral.</u>

The 'Check In and Chat' service involves volunteers phoning patients for a friendly chat. Where appropriate, they can encourage people to make positive changes and share information about other local services. People with additional vulnerabilities should be referred for Check In and Chat Plus to be linked with a DBS-checked volunteer.

Children aged 6 months to 4 years in clinical risk groups to be offered COVID-19 vaccine

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) has advised that clinically vulnerable children aged 6 months to 4 years should be offered a Covid-19 vaccine.

Although young children are generally at low risk of developing severe illness from Covid-19, infants and young children who have underlying medical conditions are over 7 times more likely to be admitted to paediatric intensive care units.

Eligible children should be offered 2 doses of the vaccine, with an interval of 8 to 12 weeks between the first and second doses.

NHS England has confirmed it will begin offering vaccinations to those eligible in England from mid-June. Parents should wait to be contacted before coming forward.

In partnership with national charity Carers UK, NHS England is offering free access to <u>Carers UK Digital</u> <u>Resource for Carers</u>, an online platform that hosts information and advice for carers to help them build resilience in their caring role.

National Care Records Service

The National Care Records Service (NCRS) is replacing the Summary Care Record application (SCRa). It provides a quick, secure way to access national patient information and it is free to use. Find out how to make the switch. All SCRa users will need to switch to NCRS before 29 September 2023.

New clinical skills training offer for community pharmacists

Health Education England (HEE) is making available 10,000 module places which will be delivered until March 2024.

This exciting new training offer will give community pharmacists the opportunity to build on their existing clinical examination and consultation skills - to assess, treat and manage common health problems.

New programme on Complex Clinical Reasoning now available

NHS England e-learning for healthcare has worked in partnership with University Hospitals Dorset NHS Foundation Trust, and St George's University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust to develop a new elearning programme on complex clinical reasoning.

To safely and effectively assess, treat and manage people in our complex health system, it is essential for professionals to use complex clinical reasoning and decision-making skills.

The new Complex Clinical Reasoning elearning programme aims to support clinicians working along the continuum of enhanced to advanced practice, who want to learn about the complexities of clinical reasoning across the NHS to develop key knowledge around the clinical reasoning process, including how to implement this in clinical practice.

This programme will be of value to many practitioners wanting to expand their field of clinical reasoning during the progression of their careers along the continuum of enhanced to advanced level practice. It has been designed to run in parallel with supervision in practice for developing clinical reasoning skills in both the elearning and clinically based components of the programme's learning advanced practice supervision and contains a detailed supervisor guidance pack to enable further critical thinking and reflection.

The programme consists of 9 elearning sessions in total, which can be accessed in any order or timeframe.

Each session sets out clear aims to help learners grow confidence in the clinical reasoning process. This includes, identifying examples of clinical reasoning strategies, describing new and outdated clinical reasoning frameworks and explaining the benefits associated with a multi-professional approach.

Upon completion of the programme, both learners and supervisors can print evidence of achievement to include within their portfolios.

Serious Shortage Protocols (SSPs)

- Date issued 13/04/2023: Serious Shortage Protocols (SSP055) has been issued for Estradot® (estradiol hemihydrate) 75micrograms/24 hours transdermal patch SSP055. This SSP will enable community pharmacists to supply patients with Evorel® (estradiol) 75micrograms/24 hours patch. The SSP came into effect 13 April and is currently scheduled to end on Friday 5 May 2023.
- Date issued 27/04/2023: A number of Serious Shortage Protocols (SSPs) currently in effect and due to end on 28 April are being extended. The revised end dates for the SSPs are shown in the table below.

If NHS Digital do not manage to increase the rate of renewal now, it will inevitably result in a rush of users requiring smartcard renewals through the Care Identity Service with increasing urgency.

This could lead to delays in access to systems and services, due to backlogs of renewals being requested for processing by Registration Authorities. Any impact on the Care Identity Service will not affect authentication and access to clinical systems for users with a valid smartcard.
