# COVID-19 Vaccination Bulletin NHS England

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## **Cross-programme updates**

#### **Key milestones**

As we move into the final third of the campaign, there are still plenty of eligible individuals to be vaccinated and a focussed effort should be made to ensure that all those who wish to take up an offer of a vaccination are able to do so, whilst preparing for the campaign end:

- A checklist of key communications activity including materials for site teams to use can be found here.
- Second reminders are now being sent to those who have not yet been vaccinated advising them that the latest date they can book an appointment on the National Booking Service (NBS) is 15 December 2023.
- Site teams should not post clinics on the NBS for dates after 15 December.
   Walk-in clinics, opportunistic vaccination and outreach however can continue until 31 January if agreed with local commissioners.

# New 12 dose (2 vials) pack size of Comirnaty® 30 XBB.1.5 to be introduced from week commencing 13 November 2023

To support vaccination sites in the second half of the Autumn Campaign by ensuring vaccine supply is aligned to demand levels, we are reducing the minimum delivery quantity for Comirnaty® 30 XBB.1.5 down to 12 doses (2 vial pack) from 60 doses (10 vial pack). The maximum packed down delivery quantity

is 36 doses (3 packs). Should a site require more than 36 doses, then this will be supplied in multiples of 60 doses (full-sized packs).

The new smaller size packs will be available for delivery from week commencing 13 November, in line with sites' replenishment requirements. By introducing this new smaller pack size now in combination with the other actions we have put in place to ensure supply is aligned with demand, we hope to support sites in minimising wastage during the final weeks of the campaign.

The linked vaccine consumables for packed down Comirnaty® 30 XBB.1.5 will be supplied in the same quantities as the full-sized pack - 100 combined needles and syringes (CNS) and 60 Patient Information Leaflets (PILs). This is due to the pack sizes of CNS and PILS currently being supplied to the Programme by UKHSA.

To mitigate the oversupply of CNS, there is an on/off logic built into Foundry, which will check when an order is raised for a site to see whether it has received an oversupply of CNS in the past 90 days. If it has, then the system will automatically reduce or remove the CNS from future orders until the residual stock of CNS is less than 50%.

For example: if a site receives a 12-dose pack of Comirnaty® 30 XBB.1.5 and has not received any oversupply in the past 90 days, 100 needles would be sent with the order but no further supplies of CNS would be sent until the site had received a further 48 doses.

#### Children turning 5 years of age part way through a primary immunisation

Eligible children aged 6 months to 4 years who commence primary immunisation with Comirnaty 3 (THREE) Concentrate and turn 5 years of age before their second primary dose is due (after a minimum interval of 3 months) should ideally complete vaccination with the Comirnaty 3 (THREE) (XBB.1.5) vaccine (this is a licensed indication).

However, a dose of Comirnaty 10 (XBB.1.5) Ready To Use vaccine is a suitable alternative, and is licensed from age 5 years irrespective of prior COVID-19 vaccination history. Vaccination should not be unnecessarily delayed in order to provide a Comirnaty 3 (THREE) (XBB.1.5) vaccine.

#### Vaccination in pregnancy communications resources

For some, flu and COVID-19 are unpleasant. But for many, including people who are pregnant, they can be very dangerous and even life-threatening. Whooping cough (pertussis) can also be very serious for young babies who are too young to start their routine childhood vaccinations.

Vaccination against flu, COVID-19 and pertussis during pregnancy helps to protect people who are pregnant and young babies against serious illness. To support uptake, communications resources are available to download from the <a href="V&S">V&S</a> workspace.

The communications toolkit has been updated to include good practice examples that tackle reducing health inequalities during pregnancy. Additional resources include slides from the September vaccinations in pregnancy masterclass.

#### **Point of Care Systems**

Help us with the next phase to design Point of Care (POC) systems used to capture and report on various vaccination data.

We are working to improve the experience of staff involved with using POC systems to capture and report on vaccination events.
