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## **Cross-programme updates**

### NEW: Q-Flow preparation for Site Managers

If you are a site that will be using the National Booking Service (NBS) and Q-Flow for the Spring COVID-19 campaign, please take the time to read our five top tips:

Existing users **reactivate your user account** – Q-Flow deactivates users that have not logged in for over 120 days. So, before the campaign please log in to ensure your account stays live and reactivate your colleagues if necessary.

- If you cannot log in, please ask another active site manager at your site to <u>manage</u> your access for you.
- If you do not have any active site managers contact your <u>SVOC</u>.

NBS will open on 15 April for the public to make bookings for appointments from 22 April onwards. We typically see high demand when NBS is opened to the public; keep checking on and after this date to ensure you have good availability on since appointments can get booked up quickly.

#### NEW: Spring 2024 COVID-19 vaccination campaign

A <u>letter</u> has been published setting out further information on preparing for a successful Spring 2024 COVID-19 vaccination campaign.

The following cohorts have now been announced and authorised for vaccination from the dates specified below:

- Residents in care homes for older adults
- Adults aged 75 years and over
- Individuals aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed (as defined in the <u>Green book, chapter 14a; tables 3 and 4).</u>

This includes those who turn 75 years old by 30 June 2024.

Visits to older adult care homes and eligible housebound patients should begin 15 April 2024. For all other eligible cohorts, vaccinations should start by 22 April 2024 and end on 30 June 2024.

#### NEW: Payment arrangements for the Spring COVID-19 campaign

From 1 April to 31 August 2024 as set out in the current COVID-19 vaccination contracts:

The £7.54 Item of Service (IoS) fee will be paid on the administration of each dose of the COVID-19 vaccination to eligible patients.

The Commissioner will pay £2.50 to the provider for the administration of each COVID-19 vaccination to each patient where the seasonal influenza vaccination is not announced and authorised for vaccination by the provider.

Vaccination of housebound patients (eligible patients classed as housebound due to being unable to leave their home at all or requires significant assistance to leave the house due to illness, frailty, surgery, mental ill health or nearing end of life and is recorded as such in their clinical notes) will attract a £10 payment per vaccine delivered. This is in addition to the £7.54 item of service fee, and the £2.50 payment (payable from 1 April 2024 to the end of the contract).

Administration of vaccination to eligible patients resident in a care home will be eligible for the £7.54 item of service fee and, if administered after 1 April 2024 (and within the term of this contract), the £2.50 payment.

For the avoidance of doubt, administration of vaccination to patients resident in a care home will not be eligible for the £10 housebound payment. This applies to all types of care homes, including non-older adult care homes.
