

The following statistics were released today by NHS England:

## NHS cancelled elective operations, quarter ending 30<sup>th</sup> September 2016

The key points from the latest release are:

- During the quarter ending 30<sup>th</sup> September 2016, 19,399 operations were cancelled at the last minute for non-clinical reasons by NHS providers. In the same period in 2015/16, there were 16,414 cancelled operations.
- Cancelled operations during the quarter represented 1.0% of all elective activity, which is an increase compared to the corresponding percentage in the same period in 2015/16.
- Of these cancellations 1,229 (6.3%) of patients were not treated within 28 days of a cancellation. In the same period in 2015/16, 965 (5.9%) of patients were not treated within 28 days.

In line with our revisions policy, we have published revisions to Q4 2015/16 and Q1 2016/17
