The following statistics were released today by NHS England:

Bed Availability and Occupancy – Quarter ending 31 December 2015:

The KH03 is a Quarterly collection from all NHS organisations that operate beds, ordinary or day case. It collects the total number of available bed days and the total number of occupied bed days by consultant main specialty. Main findings are:

- The average daily number of beds open overnight was 130,404 in Quarter 3 2015/16 compared with 130,633 in Quarter 2 2015/16.
- The average occupancy rate for all beds open overnight was 87.2% in Quarter 3 2015/16 compared with 85.7% in Quarter 2 2015/16.
- The average daily number of general and acute beds open overnight was 102,097 in Quarter 3 2015/16 compared with 102,330 in Quarter 2 2015/16.
- The average occupancy rate for general and acute beds open overnight was 89.1% in Quarter 3 2015/16 compared with 87.0% in Quarter 2 2015/16.
- The average daily number of day only beds was 12,421 in Quarter 3 2015/16 compared with 12,473 in Quarter 2 2015/16.

Notes to Editors

This dataset covers the number of beds for each NHS provider that are available for patients to have treatment or care.
