

The July 2013 data on Venous Thromboembolism (VTE) Risk Assessment in England, produced by NHS England, were released on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2013 according to the arrangements approved by the UK Statistics Authority.

## Venous Thromboembolism (VTE) Risk Assessment data collection July 2013

## The key points from the latest release are:

The key results for data collected on the number and proportion of VTE Risk Assessments carried out on adult admissions to NHS funded acute care are as follows:

- Of the 1.2 million adult patients admitted to NHS funded acute care in July 2013, as reported in this data collection, 96% of these received a VTE risk assessment on admission, a slight increase compared to 95% in Quarter 1 2013/14.
- In July 2013, the proportion of admissions receiving a VTE risk assessment was slightly lower for NHS acute care providers (96%) than IS providers (98%), with NHS acute care providers carrying out around 98% of all VTE risk assessments.
- Overall, all the regions achieved the 95% goal in July 2013. At NHS Region level, performance varied from:
  - 96.9% in the North of England, similar to the 96.3% in Quarter 1 2013/14;
  - 97.4% in the Midlands and East of England, similar to 97.1% in Quarter 1 2013/14:
  - 97.0% in the South of England, increasing slightly from the 96.7% in Quarter 1 2013/14;
  - 96.0% in London, similar to 96.3% in Quarter 1 2013/14.
- In July 2013, 268 providers (out of 313 providers who submitted data) reported that at least 95% of adult admissions were risk assessed for VTE increasing from the 259 providers (out of 316 providers who submitted data) in Quarter 1 2013/14.
