# STATISTICAL PRESS NOTICE MONTHLY CRITICAL CARE BEDS AND CANCELLED URGENT OPERATIONS DATA, ENGLAND SEPTEMBER 2017

## Main Findings - September 2017:

## **Critical Care Beds**

- There were 4,056 adult critical care beds available and 3,327 occupied, giving an occupancy rate of 82.0%. This is higher than the occupancy rate observed last month, which was 79.9%, and lower than in September 2016 (82.4%).
- There were 460 paediatric critical care beds available and 372 occupied, giving an occupancy rate of 80.9%. This is higher than the occupancy rate observed last month, which was 67.2%, and higher than in September 2016 (79.4%).
- There were 1,416 neo-natal critical care beds available and 1,027 occupied, giving an occupancy rate of 72.5%. This is higher than the occupancy rate observed last month, which was 70.8% and higher than in September 2016 (70.6%).

Table 1 shows information on critical care bed occupancy from September 2015 to September 2017.

## **Cancelled Urgent Operations**

- The number of urgent operations cancelled was 302 in September 2017, which compares to 352 in August 2017 and 373 in September 2016.
- The number of urgent operations cancelled for the second or subsequent time was 5 in September 2017.

Table 2 shows information on urgent operations cancelled from September 2015 to September 2017.

## **Revisions**

Revisions covering January to June 2017 (inclusive) have been processed this month. In most cases, the impact is minimal at national level, but February 2017 saw a large decrease in the number of urgent operations cancelled (from 339 to 317). Critical care bed occupancy figures are largely unaffected by revisions.

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#### Statistical Notes to Editors

#### 1. Critical Care data

Data relating to the number of available and occupied critical care beds is a monthly snapshot taken at midnight on the last Thursday of each month and can fluctuate from month to month.

## 2. Data Quality

Monthly SitReps data has been collected and published since August 2010. Prior to August 2010, data was collected weekly and was un-validated management information.

Critical care data published until January 2011 should be treated with a degree of caution as data on Critical Care beds was published bi-annually in a separate collection until January 2011. Since February 2011, there has been a significant improvement in the coverage and accuracy of this data.

## 3. Data Availability

Monthly Sitreps data is published approximately 3 – 4 weeks after the end of the reference period.

### 4. Revisions

Revisions to previous month's data are made in line with NHS England's revisions protocol for performance monitoring data. Future revisions will be made on a sixmonthly cycle. The revisions protocol can be found on the NHS England website at: http://www.england.nhs.uk/statistics/code-compliance/
