Baselining Exercise – March 2022

Purpose and Background



This paper provides an overview of the baselining collection, conducted by NHSEI in the first half of 21/22. The high level messages has been shared with NHS England Executive and a page summary with the DHSC COVID recovery Ministerial group.

Scope

The baselining collection asked CCGs and Community Health Services (CHS) providers to report expenditure data for 21/22, 20/21 and 19/20, and workforce and activity data for 20/21 and 19/20. This was against a core set of 43 NHS commissioned CHS only services (see annex A for the list of in scope services), to service lines and provider activity, not routinely reported elsewhere.

The exercise included all providers of community services (including the independent sector), and the 43 services were selected to include a broad coverage of the larger services provided. This was also designed to minimise the data collection burden on submitters to the baselining, however the data from the baselining exercise represents a subset of overall CHS provision (see annex B for the list of out of scope services).

This is the first time spend, activity and workforce data has been collected together about community health services at service line level. It required significant work from systems to report this information, specifically to disaggregate information within commonly used block contracts. Due to Covid block contract arrangements, expenditure reported by CCGs in 2020/21 and 2021/22 may not in all cases be reflective of actual spend on services provided during those years. Differing approaches to disaggregation have been used by systems, and this is likely to affect data quality.

Data Completeness

We received data for 73% of CCG-provider relationships, based on previous understanding of the provider landscape. Some returns were not submitted or submitted but incomplete, where data was provided for some fields but not others. This paper provides a summary of the data that was returned.

Due to incomplete returns, modelling has been undertaken with finance data to 'fill the data gap'. This creates an understanding of what expenditure would look like with full coverage. It is stated where this imputation has been applied.

Overview of Submissions



Background

- 1,845 CCG-Provider commissioning relationships in scope*
- Covering 814** providers, 42 ICSs and 106 CCGs
- Collected data on Expenditure, Activity and Workforce for a subset of 43 community health services

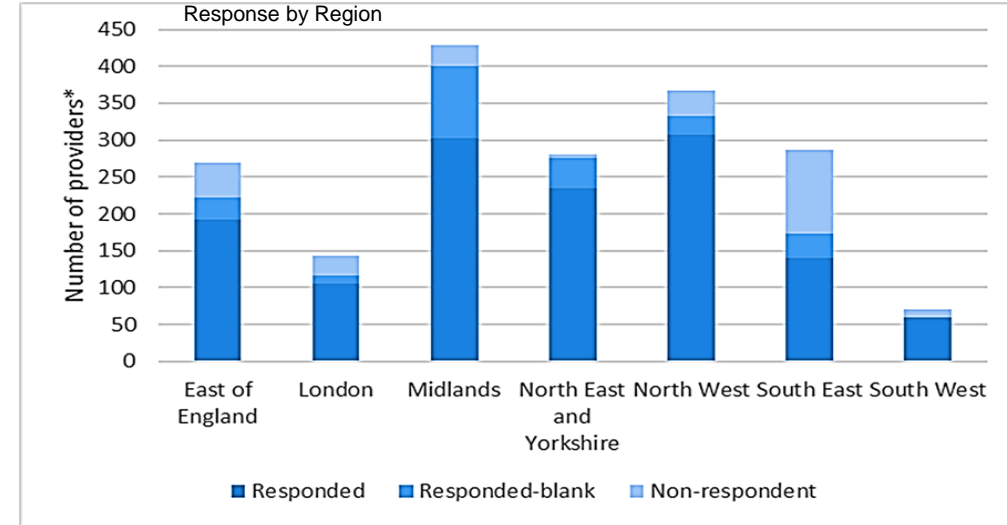
(Expenditure - 21/22, 20/21 & 19/20; Activity & Workforce - 20/21 & 19/20 only)

Response rate

- All CCGs submitted a return
- Data was submitted about 1,340 (73% of 1,845) CCG – provider relationships
- Response varies by region

Caveats

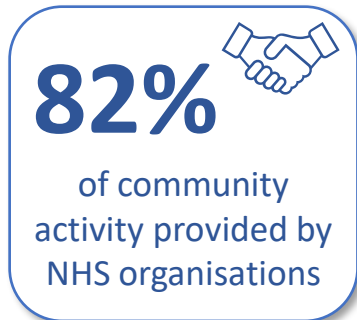
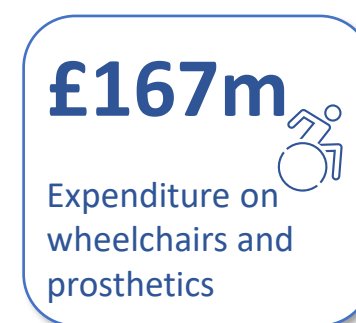
- Data only collected for providers still commissioned in 2021/22; providers no-longer commissioned in 2021/22 but commissioned in the two years prior were deemed out of scope from the whole collection. (Therefore, **data completeness for previous years is variable** as it doesn't cover all providers commissioned at the time).
- **Not all CHS data was collected, for the services in scope see Annex.**
- Data quality was highly affected by factors such as differing interpretations of service lines, difficulty allocating workforce to specific service lines and how systems have unpicked block contracts.
- For some CCG-provider relationships not all of the requested finance, activity and workforce data were submitted.



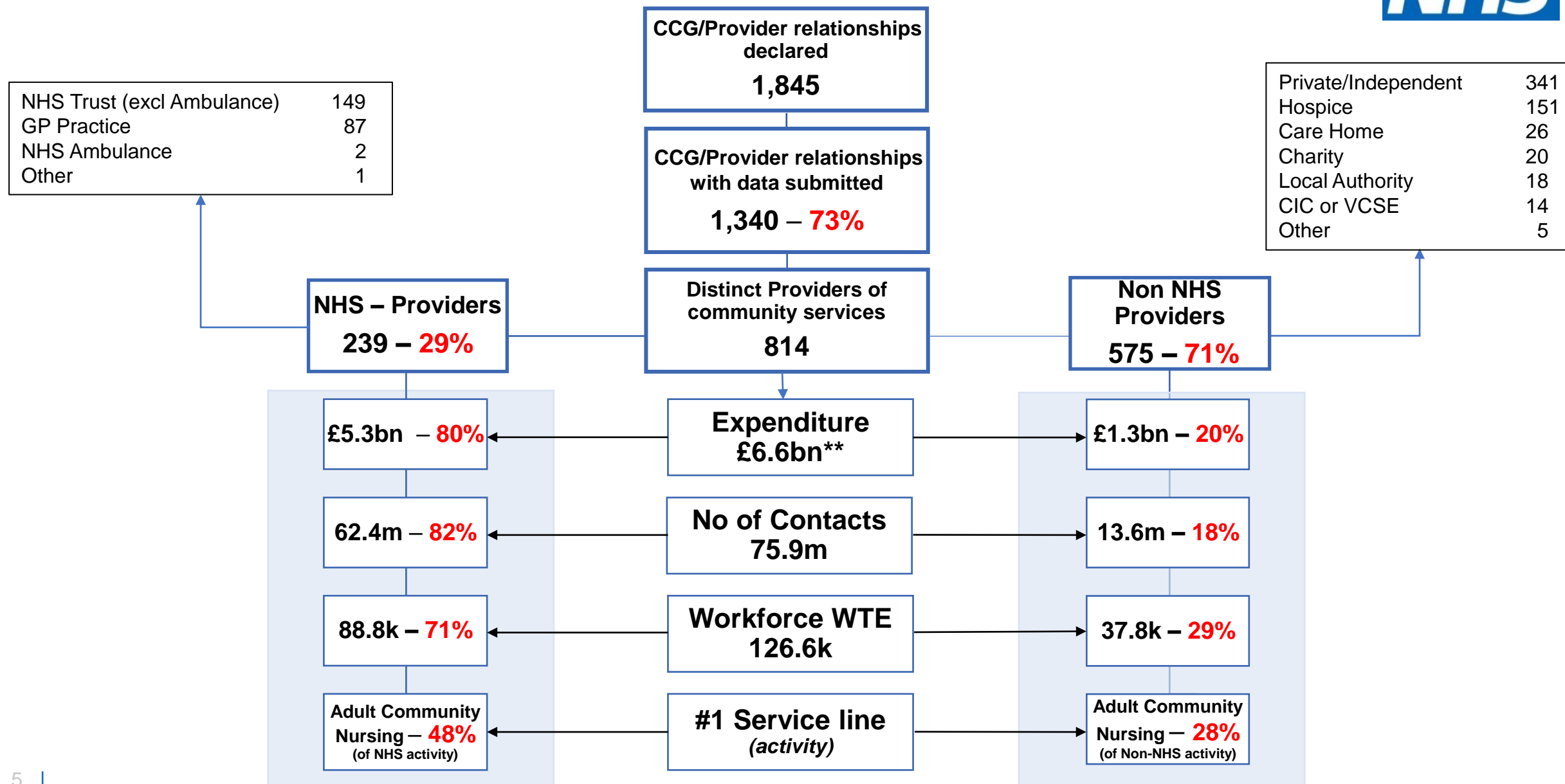

What the data on the 43 service lines tells us

Finance Headlines



Data was submitted for 73% of CCG-provider relationships, resulting in;

- £6.7bn forecast expenditure for the 43 service lines** in 21/22

When accounting for the 27% of CCG-provider relationships with missing data;

- £7.5bn estimated* total expenditure for the 43 service lines** in 21/22
- For comparison, £10.0bn was reported in the ledger (2020/21) for total spend on community services and equivalent cost centres. The £7.5bn estimated spend for the 43 service lines reported on relates to only a subset of overall community services activity, and so is not a complete view of community services expenditure.
- In addition, the baselining exercise contained exclusion criteria based on contract duration and status. In view of this approach, the baselining data will not be an exact match to other finance collections.
- Due to Covid block contract arrangements, expenditure reported by CCGs in 2020/21 and 2021/22 may not in all cases be reflective of actual services provided during those years.

*Assumes submitting providers' baselining returns (adjusted for provider type and size) are representative of non-submitters. Mean contract values (previously collected for 20/21) used for any remaining gaps in data

Finance Headlines – Annual Expenditure reported



- Spend on NHS providers is bigger by far than non-NHS providers
- Year on year comparison can not reliably be made. Only CCG-provider relationships that existed in 21/22 were in scope of the data collection. Providers in 19/20 or 20/21 who no longer had a contract in 21/22 would not be included. The small changes in market share and growth through time may be due to this limited scope in 19/20 and 20/21 data.

Finance – Top 10 reported Service Lines in 21/22



- Ten service lines provide **75.7%** (£5.1bn) of the total recorded expenditure (£6.7bn).
- Adult community nursing is the highest proportion of spend across both NHS (£1.5bn, 27.0%) and non-NHS providers (£179m, 13.4%).
- There is a distinct difference in expenditure across service types between NHS providers and non-NHS providers, with 79.6% of the spend on NHS services being accounted for by the top 10 service lines, but only 59.6% of non-NHS spend.

Activity Headlines for 20/21



Data was submitted for 73% of CCG-provider relationships, resulting in;

- 13.7m reported referrals for 43 service lines** in 20/21
- 76m reported care contacts for 43 service lines** in 20/21

Activity (care contacts) – Top 10 reported Service Lines in 20/21



- Ten service lines provide **87.3%** of the total recorded activity.
- Adult community nursing is reported to have the highest number of care contacts in both NHS and non-NHS providers.
- There is a distinct difference in activity across service types between NHS providers and non-NHS providers.

Workforce – Top 10 reported Service Lines



- Ten service lines cover **77.5%** of the recorded workforce.
- Adult community nursing has a significantly higher share of the workforce reported in NHS providers, whereas Bedded Rehabilitation Services have a significantly higher share of the workforce reported in non-NHS providers
