WV Medication Collaborative

In the Department of Health review 'Transforming care: A national response to Winterbourne View Hospital', there were deep concerns about the overuse of medications in people who have learning disabilities and behaviours that can challenge. The Winterbourne Medicines Programme was launched in spring 2014 to develop a deep understanding of the issues and test ways of improving the safety and appropriateness of medication for people with learning disabilities whose behaviour can challenge.

The programme was due to complete in Spring 2015, however an extension has been requested to ensure full dissemination of the findings The programme which ends in March 2015 has applied for an extension in funding.

NICE guidelines on this will be out to consultation at the end of December.
