	The presentation to the group was themed around the Patient Safety issue that is the inappropriate use of antibiotics.		
	There is a 5-year strategy to attack the problem globally.		
	NHSE, Public Health England (PHE) and NICE are also partners in this action.		
	There is a Patient Safety effort to drive it forward through workshops and patient safety alerts.		
	Christine Hutchinson asked if the amount of antibiotics prescribed to people with LD was overprescribed in proportion to the general population?		
	Stewart Chappell cautioned that the presentation would have to be made more accessible if given to people with LD. He pressed that this should		

	be done without the need for it to be requested.

E	Draft of 'staying Safe' a rights-based booklet for people who find themselves in an assessment and treatment unit Simon Whitehead explained to the Group that Inclusion East was approached by NHSE to produce an information booklet for the 2,600 people with LD or autism in Assessment Treatment Units. The booklet focuses on what the patients can and can't expect while there. It is written from a rights perspective of the patient. It is a 38-page document.		
	The document would be road-tested		

with a few individuals.
