Introduction to proposals on Aggregate Contract Monitoring Reports and supporting dataflows

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1 Introduction

NHS England carried out an <u>engagement process</u> in December 2017 to examine the scope for, and potential benefits of, a more standardised approach to the provision of contract monitoring reports and supporting data.

Since then, further work has been done by NHS England and NHS Digital to respond to the feedback from the engagement process, and detailed proposals are now ready to be implemented, subject to the final consultation described in this paper and the supporting documents.

2 Outline of proposals

Our proposal is, through a change to the wording of Schedule 6A of the NHS Standard Contract and through publication by NHS Digital of new Information Standards, to mandate

- a standardised format for the Aggregate Contract Monitoring (ACM) report (referred to in the Contract as the Activity and Finance Report)
- to require the submission, again in a standard format, of supporting datasets for patient activity, excluded drugs and excluded devices.

We anticipate that these new requirements will come into effect either at the start of, or during, 2019/20. The precise timing will be confirmed following consultation, if the decision is taken to proceed.

3 Rationale

The fundamental rationale for our proposal is to reduce, over time, the additional administrative burden on providers and commissioners which is caused by the current system under which contract monitoring reports and local datasets are submitted in multiple different formats.

Our understanding is that the reports and data we are referring to are already flowing from providers to commissioners – so our intention is not to create additional requirements, but to standardise the format used across the whole system. We recognise that this will involve some additional short-term effort to manage the transition to a new approach – but, once the new approach is established, the ongoing burden on both providers and commissioners should be reduced.

NHS England already requires submission of ACM reports and supporting datasets in the format proposed for its directly-commissioned services, so many providers will already be familiar with what is required.

- a draft requirement specification for the proposed patient-level activity dataset (DCB3003: Patient Level Contract Monitoring (PLCM): Requirements Specification)
- a draft requirement specification for the proposed excluded drugs dataset (DCB2212: Drugs Patient Level Contract Monitoring (DrPLCM): Requirements Specification);
- a draft requirement specification for the proposed excluded devices dataset (DCB3002: Devices Patient Level Contract Monitoring (DePLCM): Requirements Specification); and
- a model example of the proposed ACM report.

5 Questions on which we would welcome feedback

We welcome feedback on any aspect of these proposals, but we particularly wish to understand stakeholders' views on the following key questions.

- Do you support our proposal to standardise the format for Aggregate Contract Monitoring reports and supporting datasets?
- Do you agree that our proposals will help to reduce, over time, the administrative burden on providers and commissioners?
- Do you agree with the mandatory coverage we are proposing for the new arrangements?
- From what date do you think it is realistic to mandate compliance with the new arrangements?
