## CCG Dementia Assessment 2017/18

## INDEPENDENT PANEL COMMENTARY

#### Overview

Dementia is likely to touch us all at some stage in our lives; whether that be through personal experience, a loved one, friend or colleague. It is now the leading cause of death in England and has, guite rightly, been one of the six key clinical priority areas for the CCG Improvement and Assessment Framework since its inception. I, and the rest of the independent panel, continue to believe firmly that this framework can help drive improvement across the system, to improve the experience and outcomes for those living with dementia and the people that care about them. It is important to remember that the dementia assessment is based on just two measures which give a limited view of the breadth of dementia care. Whilst these two measures are important, we need to keep in mind that other facets of care will contribute to the overall experience of people living with dementia, and be mindful that some CCGs with lower performance ratings may be delivering fantastic care when the whole picture is taken into account. Having said that, we should not discount the drop in performance during 2017/18 and recognise that there is more to be done across the entire system to ensure that people living with dementia are given the best possible care. It is disappointing year on year not to see overall improvement. With so many CCGs rated as 'inadequate' or 'requiring improvement', too many people with dementia are not getting the care they have a right to.

#### **Metrics**

The **dementia diagnosis rate** continues to exceed the national ambition, but there is still significant variation at sub-national level. Whilst the number of CCGs achieving the top two performance categories ('outstanding' and 'good') has stayed broadly the same as last year, there has been a drop in the number achieving the outstanding rating. We acknowledge that those CCGs are still exceeding the national ambition, but it is important to retain a focus on dementia even once that goal is achieved. The declining performance indicates that achieving the ambition is seen as a licence to stop prioritising dementia. We urge all CCGs to address this locally.

The **care plan review** performance continues to be tightly grouped around the maximum QOF pay-out point, which means that very small changes in performance can lead to a change in the CCG's dementia rating. We urge all CCGs to consider the impact that this measure has on their overall dementia rating as a small increase in performance against this would drive up their overall dementia performance.

## Support offer

We greatly appreciate the response from CCGs since the last assessment. Yet again there is a real sense of a can-do attitude from CCGs and clinical networks, with an appetite to help generate positive change. We would like to personally thank you for this and give our assurance that we will continue to work with you on this improvement journey.

It is important to remember that the overarching aim of this assessment is to help CCGs improve their performance, ultimately for the benefit of people affected by dementia. To that end, we have developed a comprehensive support offer which will provide tiered support to CCGs based on their level of need. This can be found <u>here</u>.

Level 1 offers general support to all CCGs, including benchmarking tools and advice from clinical and policy experts. Level 2 is aimed at those CCGs needing to improve and offers further support from clinical leaders. In light of the drop in performance during 2017/18 we will be enhancing this support offer over the coming months and working with CCGs with lower diagnosis rates and fewer care plan reviews, to make sure we take advantage of all opportunities for improvement. Since last year we have introduced a self-assessment tool which we encourage CCGs to use as a first step when trying to increase diagnosis rates.

We are more than happy to receive any feedback from CCGs on this process for dementia and look forward to continuing our work with you all in the improvement phase. We are specifically interested in hearing from CCGs who have ideas for how we can improve our support offer to better meet your needs.

## **Performance ratings**

## Outstanding

A CCG assessed as outstanding is performing well against both indicators. These CCGs should strive to maintain this level of achievement as a minimum. CCGs in this category are encouraged to share best practice and learning with other CCGs and may want to volunteer to be a buddy CCG to a poorer performing CCG.

## Good

A CCG assessed as good is performing well against one indicator but has room to improve on the other. CCGs in this category may benefit from our support offer. Where a CCG is performing well against one indicator we would encourage them to share best practice and learning with other CCGs.

## **Requires improvement**

A CCG assessed as requires improvement is performing very poorly against one of the indicators or quite poorly against both. CCGs in this category are encouraged to take advantage of our support offer, particularly level 2.

#### Inadequate

A CCG assessed as inadequate needs to make significant improvements in performance against both indicators. Any CCG in this category is strongly encouraged to contact the national team for targeted support.

## Annex A – Methodology and scoring system for assessment

## Dementia

The 2017/18 rating for dementia considers two indicators: dementia diagnosis rates and care plan reviews for people with dementia.

Diagnosis rates are calculated using the number of people on the dementia register, the number of people registered with a GP and Cognitive Function and Ageing Studies (CFAS) II prevalence estimates. Care plan reviews are calculated using the number of people who have had a care plan review and the number of people on the dementia register. The indicator on the percentage of patients diagnosed with dementia who have had a face to face review of their care plan within the last 12 months is intended as a proxy measure of broader support post-diagnosis of dementia.

Each dementia indicator is assigned a band based on the thresholds shown in table 3. For the diagnosis rate indicator, the national ambition of 66.7% (two thirds) was used as the threshold for good performance. For the care plan review indicator, the thresholds used were the quartiles based on the data used in the initial assessment.

#### Table 3. Dementia indicator banding method

**To note**: The thresholds for the dementia diagnosis rate and care plan reviews indicator in table 5 have been rounded to 1 decimal place. The exact thresholds for the dementia diagnosis rate indicator are based around achieving the national ambition for a national ambition two thirds standard. Hence to 6 decimal places Band 4 = 56.666667%, Band 3 = 66.666667%, Band 2 = 76.666667%. The upper thresholds on which banding is based on for the care plan indicator are: Band 4 = 75.587062%, Band 3 = 77.553084%, Band 2 = 79.447005%

The overall rating for dementia is based on the CCG band for each of the dementia indicators as illustrated in table 4:
