GMS CONTRACT SETTLEMENT AND ALLOCATION CHANGES 2019/20 TO 2023/24

Following previous correspondence on 7th March, I am writing with details of the changes that are needed to allocations resulting from the GP contract settlement, as agreed with NHS England Finance Directorate.

Background

As the 7th March letter mentioned, the allocations paper¹ to the Board on 31st January and subsequent guidance² made clear, those allocations may have required adjustments to take account of the GP contract agreement³ which was also announced on the same day, 31st January.

Having reviewed the position thoroughly, consequential adjustments will now be made to CCG allocations 2019/20 to 2023/24 (primary care medical)⁴ which are the net effect of funding changes to the GP contract, due to the introduction of the new centrally-funded Clinical Negligence Scheme for General Practice (CNSGP) which will start from April 2019.

The scheme is funded through a one-off permanent adjustment to core practice funding. Future costs of CNSGP will be funded centrally, not met by individual practices. As a result, allocations are now being adjusted commensurately.

The table below shows the national effect of the adjustments, and the attached spreadsheet shows how the allocations have been adjusted for each CCG area.

Planning returns

These revised allocations should be used in planning returns due on Friday 4th April.

Future adjustment: Improving Access to General Practice.

As mentioned in the 7th March letter, we are currently working through the changes needed to deliver the announced funding of £6 per head into CCG allocations (primary medical care) for Improving Access to General Practice.

These changes are more complex as they involve adjustments to:

- a) CCG allocations 2019/20 to 2023/24 (primary care medical);
- b) For some CCGs, their CCG allocations 2019/20 to 2023/24 (core services) as £105 million of Improving Access to General Practice funding was previously transferred to them;
- c) NHS England 2019/20 to 2023/24 Central Allocations, where over £200 million a year will move from Central Allocations to CCG allocations (primary care medical).

In addition, the Access Review⁵ is due to commence in April 2019 and report in good time for recommendations to be implemented from 2021/22.

For this reason, we are proposing effecting the transfer of Improving Access funding from Central Allocations for 2019/20 and 2020/21 only. The intention is that transfers for the following three years would follow once the Access Review had reported and any recommendations had been implemented.

A further letter on the 2019/20 and 2020/21 adjustments will follow from mid-April.

However, this should not prevent CCGs from developing and submitting plans to the 4th April deadline, given £6 per weighted patient of funding will be made available in 2019/20 and 2020/21 as previously announced.
