### **Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the “FOI Act”)**

I refer to your email of **14<sup>th</sup> August 2017** in which you requested information under the FOI Act from NHS Improvement. Since 1 April 2016, the Patient Safety functions under section 13R of the NHS Act 2006 have been exercised by the NHS Trust Development Authority, as part of the integrated organisation known as NHS Improvement.

## **Review rights**
