## Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the "FOI Act")

We refer to your email of **20 March 2018** in which you requested information under the FOI Act from NHS Improvement.

### Your request

You made the following request:

"I would like to request copies of these x2 KPMG reports prepared for NHSI

"Deliverable A" – the "Cultural assessment report and future culture design and map"

And

*"Deliverable D" – the "Culture change implementation approach and plan" main report* 

You clarified this request on 29 March 2018 by referring to earlier correspondence with NHS Improvement from January 2018 in response to your previous request for information.

#### **Decision**

NHS Improvement does not hold the information you have requested. KPMG were never asked to produce a report, so no formal recommendations were made. Instead they provided technical knowledge, giving options to deliver an integrated structure of the (then) new organisation.

#### **Review rights**

If you consider that your request for information has not been properly handled or if you are otherwise dissatisfied with the outcome of your request, you can try to resolve this informally with the person who dealt with your request. If you remain dissatisfied, you may seek an internal review within NHS Improvement of the issue or the decision. A senior member of NHS Improvement's staff, who has not previously been involved with your request, will undertake that review.
