Review of your Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the "FOI Act")

I refer to your email of 2 March 2018 in which you requested an internal review of NHS Improvement's decision dated 2 March 2018 in relation to your FOI Act request dated 2 February 2018 in which you made the following request:

"This is a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. I would prefer to receive any information in electronic format at this email address.

1. Please provide me with a list of all NHS acute trusts and NHS foundation trusts in England and Wales, along with the following information: physical address, number of inpatient beds, and name of CEO. Please provide this data in a machine-readable file format (e.g. RDF, XML, JSON)

2. Please indicate which of the above trusts or foundation trusts have adult or paediatric neurosurgical departments."

Since 1 April 2016, Monitor and the NHS Trust Development Authority are operating as an integrated organisation known as NHS Improvement. For the purposes of this decision, NHS Improvement means Monitor and the TDA.

Decision

Section 21 provides an exemption from disclosure if the information requested is reasonably accessible to the applicant through other means. This is an absolute exemption which

means there is no requirement to carry out a public interest test if the requested information is exempt.
