One from a Royal College, one from a professional society, two charities, two manufacturers and four individuals.</p>

The draft policy proposition was distributed to stakeholders via email for a period of 2 weeks of stakeholder testing between 29th October to 12th November 2019.</p> <p>Stakeholders were asked to submit their responses via email, using a standard response and in line with NHS England's standard processes for developing policies.</p>
<p>What has happened or changed as a result of their input?</p>	<p>As a result of feedback some of the text and commissioning criteria were amended to improve accuracy or clarity.</p>
<p>How are stakeholders being kept informed of progress with policy development as a result of their input?</p>	<p>Regular updates are provided to the HIV CRG and HIV drugs subgroup which include major stakeholders such as BHIVA, HIVPA, BASSH and patient groups.</p>

<p>What level of wider public consultation is recommended by the CRG for the NPOC Board to agree as a result of stakeholder involvement?</p>	<p>No further recommended consultation is required as all the major stakeholder have had an opportunity to respond during stakeholder testing.</p>
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
