

NRLS official statistics publications: producers' roles and responsibilities

March 2018

1. Introduction

This document outlines the roles and responsibilities of NHS Improvement staff involved in producing the National Reporting and Learning System (NRLS) official statistics publications. This covers three NRLS statistics:

- national patient safety incident reports ([NaPSIR](#), previously the quarterly data summaries – QDS)
- organisational patient safety incident reports ([OPSIR](#))
- [monthly summary data](#) on patient safety incident reports.¹

2. Lead official for statistics

NHS Improvement employs a [lead official for statistics](#). The lead official has responsibility for ensuring compliance with the code of practice for statistics, pre-

release access orders, relevant legislation and the national statistician's guidance on management information. The lead official works under formal internal line management arrangements and is accountable to NHS Improvement. They are also responsible to the national statistician/head of the Government Statistical Service for professional integrity and the quality of their work. 3. Responsible statistician

The responsible statistician is responsible for producing official statistics and co-ordinating pre-release access permissions. They shall be the named contact in relation to the statistics.
