1. Welcome and apologies

1.1. Apologies for absence had been received from Sir David Behan (Associate Non-Executive Director), Lord Ara Darzi (Non-Executive Director) and Lord David Prior (Chair, NHS England). David Roberts as Deputy Chair of NHS England would address any NHS England items on the agenda.

2. Declarations of interest

- 2.1. No interests were declared over and above those held on record.
- 3. Minutes and matters arising from the private meeting held on 27 June 2019 (BM/19/15)
- 3.1. The minutes from the private meeting held on 27 June 2019 were approved.
- 4. Request for delegated responsibility for National Tariff consultation publication (BM/19/25(P))
- 4.1. The Boards received a paper setting out the policies proposed for inclusion in the statutory consultation on the 2020/21 National Tariff. The Chief Financial Officer outlined the detail of the proposals which included proposals around Best Practice Tariff and blended payments. An update was provided on the position around Market Forces Factor and the Supply Chain Company.
- 4.2. A discussion took place on the pace of change and on potential unintended consequences of tariff changes. Potential mitigating actions were considered, and Board members discussed how risks could be shared. The regional variation in feedback received was noted.

RESOLVED:

- 4.3. The Board resolved to:
 - a. endorse the policies proposed for inclusion in the statutory consultation on the 2020/21 National Tariff; and
 - b. reflecting the separation of functions in relation to the national tariff between NHS England and NHS Improvement (Monitor), as provided for in the legislation, delegate responsibility for their final decisions on the tariff consultation notice to the respective Chief Executives of NHS Improvement and NHS England, and the Chief Financial Officer (of both organisations).

5. Reports from Board Committees (BM/19/26(P))

5.1. The Boards considered a paper which provided a summary of business discussed at Board committees since the date of the last board meeting, 27 June 2019. An update was provided on the procurement of Board development support. Non-executive colleagues would be engaged in the selection process.

5.2. The Chief Financial Officer provided an update on the development of a new financial architecture for the NHS, and the Chair provided an overview of actions agreed at the Delivery, Quality and Performance Committee in the morning of 27 September. - 7. Monitor: Directors' & Officers' Liability Insurance (BM/19/28(P))
- 7.1. NHS Improvement Board members noted that as a matter of law, Monitor could not be part of the statutory indemnity schemes under which both the NHS Trust Development Authority (the TDA) and NHS England have Directors' and Officers' (D&O) liability insurance cover. In consequence, Monitor has always purchased commercial D&O cover. A paper was presented providing further context and recommending that the NHS Improvement Board (incorporating Monitor) continued with this approach.
