You said, we did – coronavirus, lockdown and shielding





We asked the group about lockdown and shielding, and their hopes and worries about the future.



You said:


1. There has not been enough clear, accessible information about coronavirus, particularly for people who are shielding.



2. Coronavirus means that some people with a learning disability and autistic people have not been able to access usual health and care services.



This includes mental health support.



3. Data about how coronavirus is affecting people with a learning disability and autistic people is being published too slowly.



This includes data about people with a learning disability who have died from coronavirus.



4. Online meetings and appointments have been more accessible for some people.





However, not everyone has access to technology, which means some people have been left out.



We did:

1. We have shared what the advisory group told us with the people in the NHS who are looking at people's experiences of lockdown and shielding.



This work is about making sure that the people most affected are listened to.



2. We have used what the advisory group said, together with what some other focus groups and Facebook surveys said.

We have made a report which has now been sent to the government to help them with their plans.
