

# NHS spring COVID-19 vaccination

## Invitation for parents or carers of children



This letter is to let you know you can book a spring COVID-19 vaccine for your child.



COVID-19 is a virus. Sometimes it's called coronavirus and it's very easy to catch



Some children are more likely to get very poorly from COVID-19.

They have a health condition or take medicine that means their bodies don't fight off infection.



They can have the COVID-19 vaccine – this includes babies from 6 months, small children to teenagers aged 15 years old.



The vaccine will help to stop them getting very poorly

## How to book your child's COVID 19 vaccine

You may be asked if your child is at increased risk and needs the vaccine.

Answer yes for this question.



Or you can take your child to a COVID-19 walk in site. You do not need to book to do this.
