Opportunity	To work with NHS England and be a member of The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism Steering Group
What this is about	<p>The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism has been created by NHS England, Skills for Care, people with a learning disability, autistic people and partners.</p> <p>This training will be used to train health and care staff, to help them better meet the needs of autistic people and people with a learning disability.</p> <p>The training was been tested with over 8,000 people who work for health and care services.</p> <p>We now are now helping health and care employers across England to get The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training for their staff.</p> <p>A group of people from NHS England and partner organisations meets to plan how Oliver's Training will be delivered across England. This group is called a 'steering group'.</p>
Who do we want to involve	We are looking for a person with a learning disability, or a person with a learning disability who is also autistic to join our steering group.
This work is about.	<p>We are working together to make The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism available for health and care staff to use. We are helping to train trainers and helping Integrated Care System to plan and do Oliver's Training.</p> <p>An Integrated Care System is a group of organisations who work together to plan and give health and care services.</p>

	<p>Oliver's Training will help to make sure that people with a learning disability and autistic people get the same quality of health and social care as everyone else.</p>
<p>What we will be doing.</p>	<p>We will hold a monthly steering group meeting.</p> <p>We will listen to how each of the 7 regions in England are doing and how much progress they are making to deliver Oliver's Training to health and care staff.</p> <p>We will learn what is working well.</p> <p>We will share ideas and good examples to help each other.</p> <p>We will give guidance and updates to regions to help them.</p> <p>Our programme has lots of different projects. All the projects are co-produced. There may be more opportunities for you to give your views.</p> <p>As well as coming to the meetings, you may also be asked to give your views on papers or plans we write for this meeting.</p>
<p>How will we do it</p>	<p>You will need to read papers before the meeting. The papers can be made in different formats such as plain English and easy read. We can give you support with this if you need it. We will try to send these a week before but sometimes it might be the day before.</p> <p>You may also need to read and send some emails.</p> <p>You will need to take part in the meeting to say if you agree with decisions and to share your views. This could be by speaking, or using the chat, by sending in ideas/notes or by voting on other people's ideas.</p> <p>You will not need to give any presentations.</p> <p>We will provide support to help you to be part of the steering group. There are other people with a learning disability and autistic people who also attend this meeting.</p>
<p>What skills, experience and networks are needed?</p>	<p>It would be great if you understand about The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training. We can also help you to learn about it.</p> <p>You should be able to read papers which may have some tricky information. We can give you support with this if you need it.</p>

	<p>You should be able to share your views and knowledge. This will help shape our work and may affect decisions made by the steering group at meetings.</p> <p>We can support you to understand the papers and share your views.</p>
<p>How much time will this take?</p>	<p>The meetings usually take place on the second Tuesday of every month. They will last for one hour and 30 minutes, from 09.30am to 11:00am The meetings will be on Microsoft Teams online.</p> <p>We know the meetings will happen until March 2024, and they may continue for longer.</p> <p>You may need to do 1–2 hours of preparation before the day of the meeting.</p> <p>There may be some work after the meeting – up to 1–2 hours.</p>
<p>What will the payments be</p>	<p>You can pay you an involvement fee. This is a payment for you being involved in the work. We will pay £150 a day for more than 4 hours of your time and £75 a half day for up to 4 hours of your time.</p> <p>You can email england.ommt@nhs.net to ask to read the expenses policy.</p>
