Health experts have given new advice about who should get the COVID-19 vaccine this year.



The government has agreed with their advice.



Some people are more likely to get very poorly from COVID-19.

You can get the vaccine if:



- You are 75 or older



- You live in a care home for older adults

- Have a health condition or take medicine that makes it harder for your body to fight off an infection. This can mean you're more likely to get very poorly from infections like COVID-19.
